- **Professional Learning Communities (PLC)** at Santa Ana College School of Continuing Education




- **Making Connections Bus Tour:** A bus tour to familiarize consortia teachers, coordinators and administrators with learning sites within the consortium boundaries




Future Strategies for Shared Professional Development
